General information



The ASPIS Open Symposium (OS) is an annual meeting of the members of the **ASPIS cluster** and the wider scientific community, focusing on advancing the safety assessment of chemicals without the use of animal testing.

The 5th annual ASPIS OS takes place on 17-18 September 2025, directly after the **EUROTOX Congress**, in Athens, Greece.

The meeting will be entirely in-person.

The symposium will present the latest work of the ASPIS cluster formed by the three Horizon 2020 consortia: **ONTOX**, **PrecisionTox**, and **RISK-HUNT3R**, focusing on the implementation of New Approach Methodologies (NAMs) for chemical risk assessment.

All ASPIS cluster members will have the opportunity to present their research through posters and flash presentations, aiming to engage the attendees in lively and informative discussions. We particularly encourage **young researchers and ASPIS Academy members** to display their work. A maximum of 42 posters and 9 flash presentations will be presented during the ASPIS OS 2025. Abstracts will be accepted on a first come, first served basis or until **14 August 2025**.

If you are interested in presenting a poster or a flash presentation, do not forget to indicate it during registration. You will receive a separate **abstract submission** form.

How to get there



- By metro, take Metro Line 3 to Megaro Moussikis and walk to The Golden Age Hotel which is within 4 minutes walking distance.
- By bus, take bus X95 to Ilisia and walk to the Golden Age Hotel which is within 7 minutes walking distance.
- By taxi, it takes approximately 40 minutes from the airport to The Golden Age Hotel.

From the city center (Syntagma Square)

By metro, take Metro Line 3 to Megaro Moussikis and walk to The Golden Age Hotel which is within 4 minutes walking distance.

From the EUROTOX Congress

Walk to the Golden Age Hotel which is within 7 minutes walking distance.


Visit Athens
